

Recycling Drop Off Facility Users Guide



The following items are accepted for recycling. Items need to be separated and kept free of trash for efficient recycling system operation.

Cardboard:

Includes: cardboard boxes, box board cuttings, kraft paper bags, cereal boxes
Please no: food contamination, wax coated cardboard, newspaper, packing materials.

Mixed Paper:

Includes: office paper, junk mail, magazines, phone books.

Newspaper:

Includes: newsprint.



Plastic #1:

Includes: soda bottles, cooking oil bottles, peanut butter jars. Please empty liquids (rinsing not necessary) and you can leave the caps on.



Plastic #2 (Natural):

Includes: milk jugs and is milky (foggy) in color but not dyed. Please empty liquids (rinsing not necessary) and you can leave the caps on.



Plastic #2 (Colored):

Includes: liquid detergent bottles, bleach bottles. Plastic has been dyed and may be a vivid color or white. Please empty liquids (rinsing not necessary) and you can leave the caps on.

Aluminum: (beverage containers only)

Steel Cans:

Includes: soup cans, coffee cans. Please remove food.

Glass: (all colors except brown)

Please empty bottles and food containers.

It is **not** necessary to:

- Rinse cans
- Remove labels
- Remove plastic caps (regardless the type of plastic)

The following items **cannot** be accepted for recycling due to limited or no recycling options:

- plastics #3 through #7
- shredded paper
- Styrofoam or packing material
- grocery bags (plastic)
- brown glass
- plastic wrap
- aluminum foil

HOUSEHOLD HAZARDOUS WASTE

Household hazardous waste is accepted in containers no larger than 5 gallons. No more than 20 gallons of any one item may be dropped off for disposal or reuse, per visit; no more than 2 of any one item of electronic waste. There is no charge to drop off household hazardous waste. Waste accepted includes:

- Electronic Waste
- Paint
- Paint Thinner
- Stain
- Household cleaners
- Batteries (Lead Acid)
- Batteries (rechargeable)
- Pesticides
- Fertilizers
- Oil
- Antifreeze
- Automotive Products
- Propane Tanks
- Gasoline
- Kerosene
- Diesel Fuel

REUSE SHED

The reuse shed is available as a service to area residents. Unwanted household hazardous waste is dropped off at the household hazardous waste collection area for reuse or disposal. Items unopened or usable are placed in the reuse shed and can be taken by interested customers at no charge. Many items may be available for reuse, to include:

- Paint
- Paint Thinner
- Stain
- Household Cleaners
- Pesticides
- Fertilizers
- Unused Oil
- Unused Antifreeze
- Automotive Products

This facility is for hazardous waste coming from households only. If your business generates hazardous waste a list of commercial disposal facilities is available from the household hazardous waste attendant or at the scale house.
